A perfectly normal tale, except that in McCarthy's America of 1952, when this cult novel about lesbian love was originally published under a pseudonym, anything that was a little out of the ordinary was viewed with extreme suspicion.

The Price of Salt is the only novel by Patricia Highsmith about a fulfilled love, a love perceived as happiness rather than as a wicked delusion. Never again would the author, who began working on this novel in the wake of a personal encounter, write such sensuous, poetic and sexy prose.

Patricia Highsmith was born in Fort Worth, Texas, in 1921. Her first novel, *Strangers on a Train*, was made into the famous film by Alfred Hitchcock in 1951. *The Talented Mr. Ripley*, published in 1955, was awarded the Edgar Allan Poe Scrolle by the Mystery Writers of America and introduced the fascinating antihero Tom Ripley. In February 1995 Patricia Highsmith died in Switzerland, where she resided much of her life.


