When the painter comes to make an altarpiece for the church, Martin knows that by the end of the winter, he'll be leaving with him. He'll go with him and not give even a backward glance.

The people in the village have spoken often about the painter. Now he's there, and he wants to get inside the church, but the key is missing. The three most outspoken men in the village – Henning, Seidel and Sattler – search for the key, crawling through the rose hips in front of the church gate. The wind billows their shirts and trousers and pulls their hair back and forth. In between searches, the men rattle the church door. In turn. Because maybe the other one shook it the wrong way, after all. Each time, they are amazed that the door is still locked.

The painter stands by, watching and grinning cheekily, with his shabby possessions beside him. They had probably imagined him differently, but painters don't fall from the sky around these parts. Especially not now, in the war.



As a funeral orator, one of my roles is to hold and bear the stories that are entrusted to me about the deceased. Sometimes that also means listening to stories which, on any other occasion, would strike me as absurd, but which seem perfectly logical as a mourner. Over time, I learnt how comforting these inexplicable moments can be to someone who is grieving. They make us feel connected with a world that can often seem cold and strange in the midst of grief. The sun that shines through the circular window at the beginning of the funeral service, directly onto the urn of a sun worshiper.

The rain that stops at a live concert at the very moment when the band begins to play a deceased girlfriend's favourite song. It's often the natural world that sends us messages of comfort: the roses that bloom longer than usual in a man's garden, bringing him joy on his deathbed. The butterfly that flutters into the chapel during a farewell service, coming to rest on an urn that has been decorated with a butterfly design. These are the small miracles with which everyday life seems to gift us when we need them most; or to which we are particularly sensitive while we mourn, when the once-familiar world suddenly seems unfamiliar.




LOUISE BROWN was born in London in 1975 and moved with her family to East Holstein in northern Germany as a teenager. She studied Political Science in northern England, Kiel and Berlin. She is a journalist and has also been a funeral orator in Hamburg for five years, where she facilitates the first Death Café.
