

My mum died last summer.

A song on the radio was now just sound, no longer an invitation to sing along, even though neither of us knew the words. A burst of rain just weather, no longer an opportunity to run outside and dance barefoot in a puddle.

It might sound poetic, but only on paper. Fourteen is a shit age to lose your mum. Grief ebbs and flows like the tide, but it's always there.

My mum was buried on the hottest day of the year. The birds faltered in the white sky and the lizards withdrew into the shadows of the headstones. Rose bushes bloomed along the edge of the path, the breeze wafting their sweet scent towards the grave. The heat distended time and slowed all movement.

I wiped my sweaty hands on my dress and stared into the hole at my feet. At the bottom was the coffin. On it lay sunflowers, and in it lay my mum. Dark curls framing her face, red lips in a mocking smile, and her feet in her white cowboy boots, or so I pictured.



ELENA FISCHER, born in 1987, studied comparative literature and film in Mainz, where she lives with her family. In 2019 and 2020, she participated in the Darmstadt Text Workshop, led by Kurt Drawert. In 2021 she was a finalist at the 29th \square Open Mike \square with an extract from her debut novel *Paradise Garden*, and won a prize for young authors from the provincial government of Mainz.

In the San Fernando Valley, every address has five numbers. The streets run straight and wide, intersecting at right angles. The sidewalks are perfectly flat and the gutters have gentle slopes to accommodate bicycles and roller skates. There is a well-planned sense of order that makes teenagers turn fierce and wild.

Also, almost everyone I'm about to tell you about ended up dead or in prison.

1981

I am fourteen and part of a secret pack of biting wolves. At night, I sneak out my bedroom and move like a shadow past the tract homes with identical squares of grass and rectangles of driveways, counting how every eighth one looks like my alpine gingerbread house. Behind the gas station next to the freeway, I meet up with the twins and we smoke out. Dizzy and deep in our own secret language, we stash the bong in the bushes and lay by the edge of the wall above the freeway. We let gravity roll us fast down the steep slope of spring-loaded iceberg plants till we reach the virgin blacktop where the painted white lines glow like milk under the moon.



TAMAR HALPERN is a filmmaker and author. She studied broadcast journalism and film production; her documentaries are prize-winning. Halpern teaches directing and screenwriting, and is the founder of the start-up CitySearch. She lives in Los Angeles.

Cool, bolshie, vulnerable. This is Timey.





ANDREJ KURKOW, born in St. Petersburg in 1961, has lived in Kyiv since childhood and writes in Russian. He studied foreign languages, was a newspaper editor and, during his military service, a prison guard, and wrote numerous screenplays. ANDRZEJ SZCZYPIORSKI (1928 – 2000) was born in Warsaw, took part in the city's uprising against German occupation in 1944 and was subsequently sent to Sachsenhausen concentration camp. After the war, he worked as an author and publisher and became a member of the executive board of the Polish PEN Club and the Writer's Association. In December 1981, he was interned in a camp and remained a prisoner there until spring 1982. In 1989, he was chosen as a candidate by Solidarnosc and elected to the Polish Senate by the people. He received the Austrian >State Award for European Literature< and the >Order of Merit of the Federal Republic of Germany<.





PETROS MARKARIS, born in Istanbul in 1937, is a playwright, who worked as an author with Theo Angelopoulos (director of *Eternity and a Day, Ulysses' Gaze* etc.), and translated the works of German dramatists like Brecht and Goethe. 

She is a journalist and has also been a funeral orator in Hamburg for several years, where she facilitates the first >Death Café<. Where does Hallelujah come from?

It is a compound of »Hallel« and »Yah«, where »Yah« is the short form of Yahweh, the God of Israel. Hallel is a primal sound that is widespread in the Arab world for example, but people around the world say »hello« or »hallo« as a greeting. »Hallel« can express almost anything, including pain. But in essence it is a praise, a jubilant sound, for which the famous Hallelujah chorus in George Friedrich Handel's Messiah is a good example.

Why are there no women in church offices?

Women are permitted to hold offices in the church, they are just not allowed to represent Jesus, since Jesus was a man.

That is nonsense, of course.

But already in the 1st chapter of the Bible it says: »God created man in his own image, male and female«. Only in the wake of feminism did it become a problem to imagine a male-only God. Ultimately, attributing a gender to God is a limitation of his omnipotence.

There have been endless discussions about this question, about these first verses of the Bible, filling entire libraries. However, there is always the question of who has the sovereignty of interpretation, and in the Catholic Church this lies with the Pope and in patriarchal societies with men.



OTHMAR KEEL, born in Einsiedeln in 1937, is emeritus professor of Old Testament Exegeses and the Biblical environment. He has revolutionised the interpretation of the Bible by adducing Ancient Near Eastern objects, images and symbols. The Bible + Orient Museum in Fribourg came out of this research. His work has been translated into numerous languages. Othmar Keel is married, has two children and four grandchildren. He lives in Fribourg.
