A book that you can't put down until you have read the last sentence.



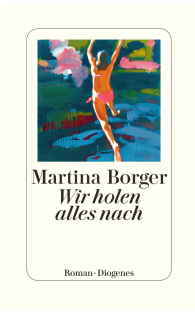

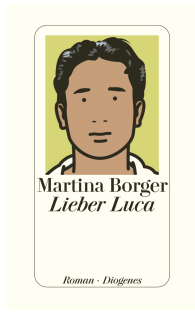

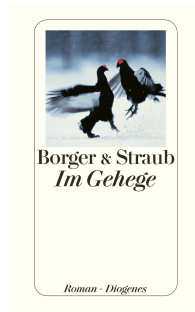
