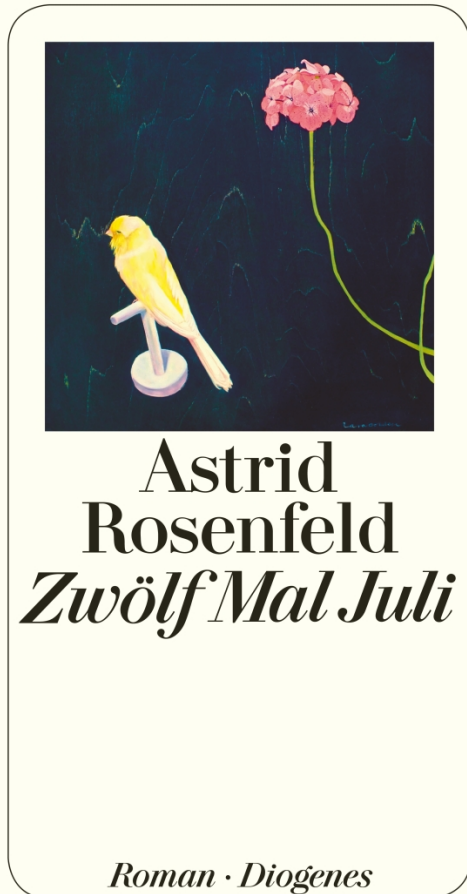

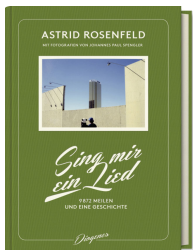
Astrid Rosenfeld

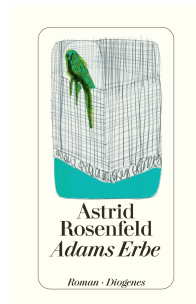
