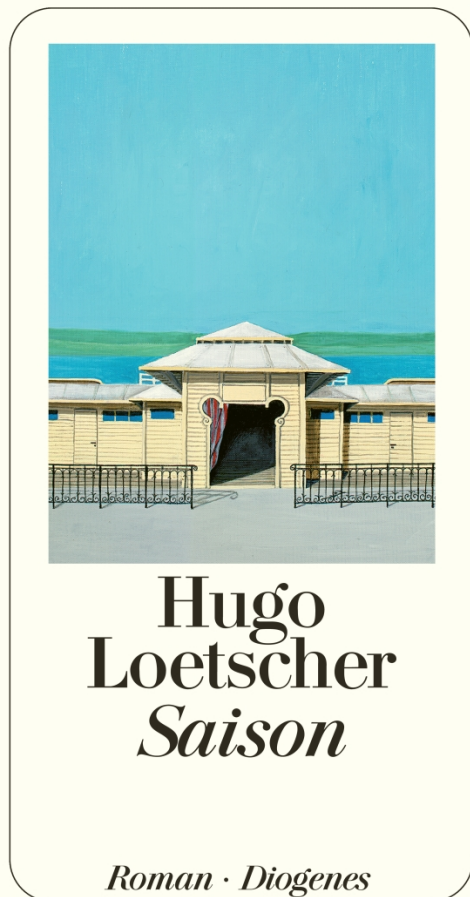

Real life serves as a dress rehearsal for Philipp's first season. With a fertile, unencumbered imagination, he turns a Zurich lake bathing spa into a colourful and exciting stage, a scene in which figures of our contemporary society, stripped of their disguises, are revealed in their true colours. The author writes in a vivid, pithy language and with an enigmatic wit which injects poetry into the irony. Philipp's first season - »It's not for nothing that I have just turned twenty« - is also the setting of a tender love story.

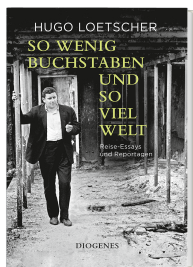

Hugo Loetscher (1929 – 2009) was one of Switzerland's most famous writers with novels such as *Sewage* and *The Immune Man*. In his role as journalist, he travelled to Latin America, Southeast Asia and the USA regularly. He always held a particular interest in photography. Hugo Loetscher, who lived in Zurich, was a visiting lecturer at universities in Switzerland, the USA, Germany and Portugal; and a member of the Darmstadt Academy for Language and Poetry. In 1992, he was awarded the ›Schiller Prize‹ by Switzerland's Schiller Foundation.
