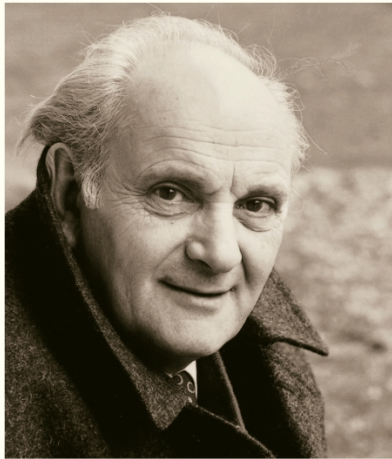

The fact that Szczypiorski is not only a great narrator but also a brilliant essayist was already evident in his *Notizen zum Stand der Dinge* (Notes on the State of Things). Now all his essays and speeches are united in one volume with which Szczypiorski – »the great European« (Klaus Kinkel) – became a household word in recent years, above all the speech on the anniversary of the reunification of Germany on October 3rd 1994 in Bremen.

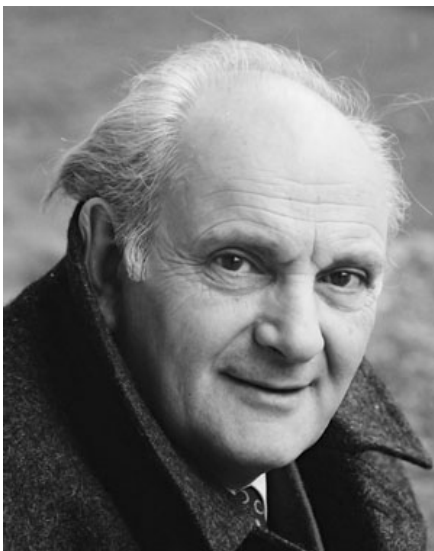
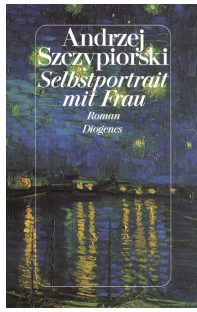

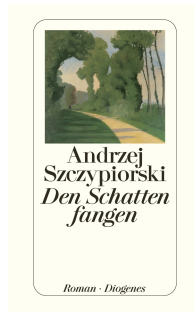
Andrzej Szczypiorski (1928 – 2000) was born in Warsaw, took part in the city's uprising against German occupation in 1944 and was subsequently sent to Sachsenhausen concentration camp. After the war, he worked as an author and publisher and became a member of the executive board of the Polish PEN Club and the Writer's Association. In December 1981, he was interned in a camp and remained a prisoner there until spring 1982. In 1989, he was chosen as a candidate by Solidarnosc and elected to the Polish Senate by the people. He received the Austrian »State Award for European Literature« and the »Order of Merit of the Federal Republic of Germany«.



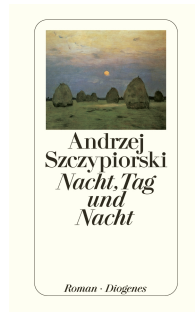

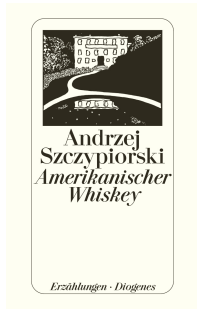
