

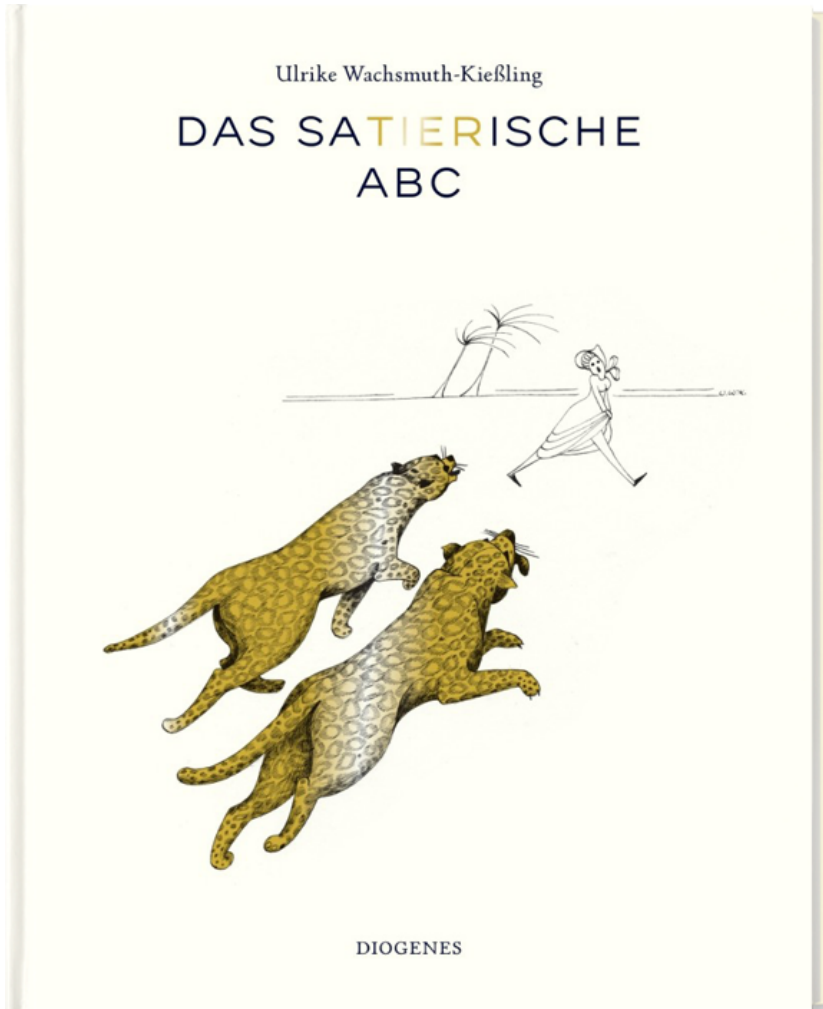
Ulrike Wachsmuth-Kissling

She later worked as an assistant to the set designer Erich Kettelhut, and became a set painter for the UFA. After marrying she worked as a freelance painter and illustrator of books and magazines.
