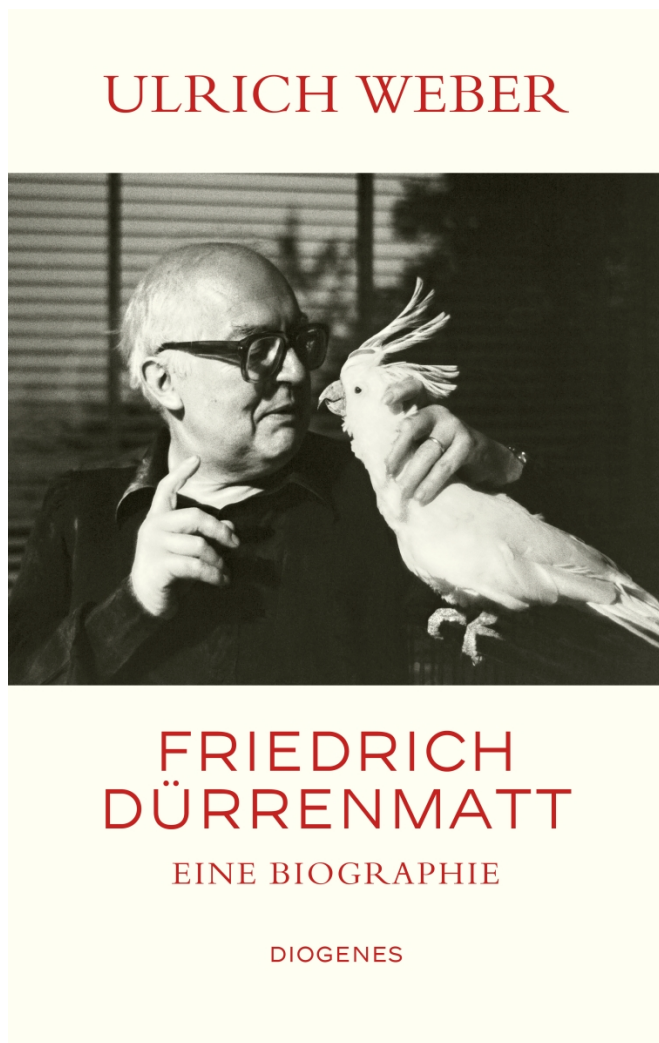


Ulrich Weber
